

Exodus 16:4-7a, 13-15, 27-31

⁴ Then the Lord said to Moses, 'I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. ⁵On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.' ⁶So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, 'In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, ⁷and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord, because he has heard your complaining against the Lord.

The **10:35 am Church From Scratch Worship Service** blends all different types of music, arts, liturgy and free-form worship to help guide newcomers and experienced alike in the worship of God. **During the Summer** (thru Labor Day Weekend) and on **Family Worship Sunday**, selected Sundays throughout the year, we come together as one worshipping family at **9:30 am**.

A **Nursery**, (downstairs) is available for children two and under at both worship hours. A **"Family Room"** on the right side of the Sanctuary is available, as well.

9:00 & 10:35: Children join their families in the Sanctuary for opening worship and "Learning with Our Children", then proceed downstairs for class. The sign-in sheet at both hours is located in the main hallway outside the Sanctuary doors; sign-out downstairs in Fellowship Hall.

This is particularly important after the 9 am service so our teachers can put away materials and set up for the 10:35 class. We are in need of two types of volunteers for this rewarding outreach:

- We need 11 people who are willing to cook a macaroni and cheese casserole that will feed 8 folks. Kathleen Harvey and Marcia Lavochkin will be at a table in the lobby today and next Sunday with a recipe and foil pan that you can take home. Then you can just drop off the casserole at the church on that Thursday, August 4.
- We need about 10 folks who'd like to go to Joshua Station, take a brief tour, set up the tables and chairs, serve the food, enjoy the meal with the families who live at Joshua Station, and then clean up afterward. The tour starts at 4:30 and the meal starts at 6:00 pm. You can sign up for this in the lobby or contact Tom Olschner.

Joshua Station is part of Mile High Ministries, located at about I-25 and 8th Avenue. About 30 families live at Joshua Station, but they do much more than just live there. They participate in regular life skills classes, they meet with their family advocate to set personal goals and then achieve them, most receive regular counseling, and they work as a community to support each other. It is a very special experience to share a meal with these families who are working hard to overcome challenges they've had and gain the skills to be self-sufficient.
